Tackling Poverty Problems with Innovative Solutions Winners of SI CEO Competition for Tertiary Students Announced

Top three winners awarded HK\$300,000 start-up fund and social innovation trip to UK/Singapore

The SI CEO Competition for Tertiary Students co-organised by the Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Fund (SIE Fund) and Youth.gov.hk held the final pitching and award presentation ceremony today (22 April). "ElderTreks" formed by students of City University of Hong Kong won first place as well as the "Most Social Innovative Award" and the "Most Liked Award (Live Voting)" in the final contest. Other award winners were also unveiled (details in the attached table).

At the final pitching, the five finalist teams presented their business plans and the best three were selected by the judges right on the spot. The three winning teams were awarded a start-up fund of HK\$150,000, HK\$100,000, and HK\$50,000 respectively, with each also winning a social innovation trip to UK or Singapore to visit social innovation projects. Other awards were also presented at the award presentation ceremony, including the "Most Liked Award" won by "QiDai" with the highest votes in public voting held earlier.

In his welcome speech, the Chief Secretary for Administration, Mr Matthew Cheung Kin-chung, said that the competition attracted active participation by tertiary students as well as strong support from social enterprises, NGOs, social innovation experts, celebrities and business leaders. Mr Cheung added that the competition demonstrated not only successful cross-sector collaborations but also a new way for parties from different professions to create social value. He also looked forward to the early implementation of the students' business plans to benefit people in need.

The SI CEO Competition for Tertiary Students drew an overwhelming response from more than 350 students in 26 tertiary institutions, with a total of 139 business plans received, around three subthemes, namely "Social Inclusion", "Care for Elderly", and "Food Support". These business plans came with great diversity which was a manifestation of students' sincerity and passion in the attempt to tackle poverty and other social problems.

The competition received support from different sectors of society. They included celebrities and corporate CEOs who accompanied the students in a series of experiential programmes, social innovation experts who shared their insights, as well as business leaders and university professors who took part as judges and provided guidance to the finalist teams. Besides, over 7 500 members of the public showed support by casting votes online in about a fortnight, by which they selected their favourite among the five finalist plans. The overall response was encouraging.

The SIE Fund is committed to promoting social innovation, nurturing social entrepreneurs and supporting innovative projects with the aim of creating social impact and building social capital for supporting poverty relief. Centred around the theme of "Tackling Poverty Problems with Social Innovation" and in line with the Fund's objective, the SI CEO Competition helps deepen students' understanding of social innovation and poverty alleviation while inspires them to develop innovative solutions to tackle social problems, particularly on poverty and social exclusion, through experiential programmes, talks and competition.
